This helps students plan and make informed choices about the courses they select while balancing their financial resources. Typically, this material should be available for review at the time of registration.

Course Material "Adoptions":

Adopting course materials is a process by which faculty provide the bookstore with information on required and optional materials for each of their courses.

Inclusive Access: Inclusive Access (also First Day Access) is a course material delivery model where discounted digital materials are automatically delivered to students on or before the first day of class.

Open Educational Resources (OER): Teaching and learning materials in any format that reside in the public domain or are under copyright released under an open license, that permit free use and re-purposing by others.

Other: Any other items that students need to participate in the course, like iClickers, uniforms, calculators, etc.
