

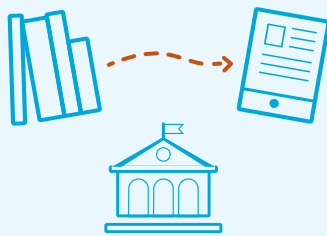
Best Practices for Teaching With Digital
